Celebration of School Improvement



Our Chair of Governors Peter Tite, our CEO John Stephens and Gary Handforth Director of Primary Education attended Melland High School's Summer Celebration on Thursday 13th July and this is what John had to say about our annual event.

"A remarkable event at Melland. Sue Warner and her team had put together a celebration of school improvement in which the work of the school over the last year was presented to staff, parents/carers, governors, partners and visitors through a series of filmed or live performances by the students themselves. I have never before seen such an innovative way for a school to express its accountability to the people that it serves. The progress of the students over their time at Melland was not simply told to us – it was enacted before us. A great example of the kind of innovative practice that so often emerges from the special school sector of necessity. I was particularly struck by two things. The first was the insistence on quality. Whatever the children did in this presentation, they were expected to do it to a very high standard. The second thing that struck me was the young people's readiness for work at the end of their time at Melland. The progress that the youngsters are making, the richness of the opportunities offered to them and the commitment to continuous improvement are some of the reasons why this school is so impressive".



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Safety in the Community

During the Spring and Summer term, Learner Groups 1 and 2 have been researching and learning about how to stay safe when out and about in the community.

Graham Construction and CCS Display



The whole school community gained insights into the support offered to young people by training organisations and colleges such as, 'Challenge for Change', 'United Response', 'Access to Music', The Together Trust', 'Manchester' College', 'Pure Innovations' and Challenge for Change'. Jodie Booth discussed 'Internships' and the 'Specialist Resource Team' gave out valuable information about short preaks. All the information provided will help students and their families work towards their future destinations as well with relevant information to share during the EHCP process.
