I would like to extend my heartfelt congratulations to Melland High School for your fantastic production of Othello as part of the 2018 Shakespeare Schools Festival. It was a brilliant night of theatre, and I'd like to highlight just a few elements that really stood out.

Many Congratulations Melland High! I was so impressed with your performance of Othello, and must give particular praise to your strong, rich and resonant voices (reminiscent of shows I have seen at The Royal Shakespeare Company!). It was clear that you understood every word that you were saying and, as a result, spoke with clarity, expression, character and emotion and it was beautiful to listen to. Excellent work!

Your ensemble work was equally strong. Every actor on stage (in the fore and background) was fully engaged, focused and in character at all times. You created strong, visually stunning and poignant tableaux, which expertly conveyed the emotion of the scenes and the narrative. Big Draw Arts Festival

Students drew their designs onto a 2D net of the casket, each face of the cube being a different theme, then cut the net out and then folded and glued it into a 3D cube. Bloxels

Key stage 4 and 5 classes have been using Bloxels to create their very own computer games. We are one of the first schools in the country to be using this computer science tool!

Bloxels is a hands-on, brains-on, creativity and technology experience. Bloxels uniquely unlocks students' innate creativity by grasping something they love: video games. Students can play fun games as they gain greater understanding of important topics like design logic, computer science and mathematics through the games they create. It completely ticks all the boxes when it comes to Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM). Here at Melland, some groups have the programming as a secondary skill and we use Bloxels to improve fine motor skills, colour recognition, teamwork, communication, sequencing, following instructions and, of course, imagination.



Evidence For Learning







Evidence for learning is an App we have introduced in Learning Zone 3, which enables us to capture learning as it happens. We are able to take photographs and videos and add our written observations to gather evidence of how each student is making progress towards their individual learning intentions. The App allows us to link our evidence, including written comments and photographs to our own assessment framework to support teachers in making judgements about progress. It also allows us to send home photographs, videos and comments to parents/carers securely via an email account and

enables parents/carers, through the App, to let us know how their son or daughter is making progress at home against their learning intentions. The App has made a big difference to how we collect information about how our students are learning. It means we produce simple reports showing the learning journey a student makes at the click of a button. Tutors and class teachers can capture how learners develop across school in lessons and in tutor group so we can support the process of generalising the students' learning.

V Group Ramble On

As part of the ongoing life skills curriculum, V group have been exploring Manchester's walking trails and country parks to discover "What can I see". With the changing of the seasons, V group have been learning to observe their surroundings and explore the exciting changes in nature.
